- Partner with Broader Impacts mentors working directly in the field to understand the impacts of One Health research to real world problems, and explore career options in the field.
- Build lasting professional relationships with their undergraduate peers, graduate students, and mentors.

You will need a 1-2 page resume (include education experiences, relevant work history, awards/scholarships, and volunteer/service activities), a copy of your unofficial transcript, and a short (100-500 words) personal statement detailing why you are interested in gaining research experience in general and within One Health in particular. As well, you will be directed to request at least 1 letter of recommendation; your application can not be considered complete until at least one letter of recommendation has been received.
